The club, which was launched in Bradwall Road in 1991, caters for more than 400 children each week.

The centre offers gymnastics from beginner to international standard, for girls and boys aged four-16.

The club has been represented at international level in Belgium, Sweden, Holland, USA, Australia, Hungary, Romania and Italy.
